Preparations

Preparations for the 1st Transnational Meeting of **" No Cyberbullying At The School "**Erasmus+ project took place in March 2017, the coordinating school made practical arrangements, such as booking the hotel, preparing the programme, providing information on how to arrive to the school etc. Participants made travel arrangements: booking flights, buying insurance, prepared all the necessary information for the meeting.

Organization

The 1st Transnational Meeting of "**No Cyberbullying At The School**" Erasmus+ project took place over two days, with Day One and Day Two taking the form of meetings combined with introduction of partners, project and visits to museums and Day Two consisting of administration of the project and visit to Anitkbabir and school.

DAY 1, WEDNESDAY 29th MARCH 2017

Cyber Bullying

It could be defined as deliberate and repeatedharming behaviour made through electronic texts.

According to a study by Barra and Mitchell (2004) in the United States on children and young people who regularly use the internet between the ages of 10-17,

 approximately one-fifth of the participants was confused with the cyberbullying,

- 4% were victims of cyber,
- · 12% were bullied,
- 3% were bullied / victimized.

Another survey of 3767 students in sixth, seventh and eighth grades in order to determine the prevalence of cyberbullying among secondary school students found that

 \cdot 11% of the students were exposed to cyberbullying at least once in the last few months

4% were bullied

7% were both bullied and victimized (Kowalski and Limber, 2007).

Researchs of Ayaş and Horzum in 2012 showed that victims generally don't talk about cyber bullying.

We had a city tour including visits to "Anatolian Civilization Musuem", "Koç Museum" and "Ankara castle".












DAY 2, THURSDAY 30th MARCH 2017 The second day of meeting was dedicated to working sessions and administration of the project.














These are the issues discussed:

We have agreed on that all the tasks will be done on time and shared with all partners. We have also discussed the terms of sharing all documents and our Polish participant suggested a project management tool in which we can replicate our project in online workplace. All partners agreed on to use that platform which will faciliate our communication.

4. Creation of an Erasmus Corner:

We have agreed that all partners will create an Erasmus corner in their organisations concerning all aspects of our project- general information about cyberbullying, partners, meetings etc.

The participants had some time to meet and talk to Turkish students by school orientation.
